

- Bids on equipment must be standard new equipment, latest model, except as otherwise specifically stated in proposal or detailed specification. Where any party of nominal appurtenances of equipment is not described, it shall be understood that all equipment and appurtenances which are usually provided in the manufacturer's stock model shall be furnished.
- 2. Bids on materials and supplies must be for new items except as otherwise specifically stated in bid or detailed specification.
- 3. Bidder declares that the bid is made without any connection with any other Bidder, submitting a bid for the same items, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud.
- 4. PRICES The provisions of the New York State Fair Trade Law (Fed-Crawford Act) and the federal price discrimination law (Robinson-Patman Act) do not apply to purchases made by the Nassau Health Care Corporation.
- 5. SURETY In the event that an award is made hereunder, The Director of Purchase, Nassau University Medical Center, (hereinafter known as the Director of Purchase) reserves the right to request successful bidders to post, within one week, security for faithful performance with the understanding that the whole or any part thereof may be used by the Nassau Health Care Corporation to supply any deficiency that may arise from any default on the part of the Bidder. Such security must meet all the requirements of the County Attorney and be approved by the Nassau Health Care Corporation Attorney.
- 6. SAMPLES Samples, when required, must be submitted strictly in accordance with instructions, otherwise bid may not be considered. If samples are requested subsequent to bid opening they shall be delivered within five (5) days of the request for bid to have consideration. Samples must be furnished free of charge and must be accompanied by descriptive memorandum invoices indicating if the Bidder desires their return; also specifying the address to which they are to be returned, provided they have not been used or made useless by tests. Award samples may be held for comparison with deliveries.
- 7. AWARD The Director of Purchase reserves the right before making award to make investigations as to whether or not the items, qualifications or facilities offered by the Bidder meet the requirements set forth herein and are ample and sufficient to insure the proper performance in the event of award. The Bidder must be prepared, if requested by the Director of Purchase to present evidence of experience, ability and financial standing, as well as a statement as to plant, machinery and capacity of the manufacturer for the production and distribution of the material on which he is bidding. Upon request of the Director of Purchase, successful bidder shall file certification from the manufacturer relative to authorization, delivery, service and quarantees. If it is found that the conditions of the bids are not compiled with or that articles or equipment proposed to be furnished do not meet the requirements called for, or that the qualifications, financial standing or facilities are not satisfactory, the Director of Purchase may reject such bids. It is distinctly understood, however, that nothing in the foregoing shall mean or imply that it is obligatory upon the Director of Purchase to make any examinations before award; and it is further understood that, if such examination is made, it in no way relieves the Bidder from fulfilling all requirements and conditions of the bid.
- 8. Awards will be made to the lowest responsible Bidder. Cash discounts will not be a factor in determining awards, except in tie bids. Consideration will be given to the reliability of the Bidder, the qualities of the materials, equipment or supplies to be furnished, their conformity with the specifications, the purpose for which required and the terms of delivery.
- 9. The Director of Purchase reserves the right to reject any and all bids in whole or in part and to waive technical defects, irregularities and omissions if in his judgment the best interests of the Nassau Health Care Corporation will be served.
- 10. Unless otherwise indicated herein, the Director of Purchase reserves the right to make award by items, by classes, by groups of items or as a whole.
- 11. DELIVERIES Upon failure of the Vendor to deliver within the time specified, or within reasonable time as interpreted by the Director of Purchase, or failure to make replacement of rejected articles, when so requested immediately or as directed by the Director of Purchase. The Director of Purchase may purchase from other sources to take the place of the item rejected or not delivered. The Director of Purchase reserves the right to authorize immediate purchase from other sources against rejections on any order when necessary. On all-such purchases the Vendor agrees to promptly reimburse the Nassau Health Care Corporation for excess cost occasioned by such purchases. Should the cost be less, the Vendor shall have no claim to the difference. Such purchases will be deducted from order quantity.
- 12. An order may be cancelled at the Vendor's expense upon nonperformance. Failure of the Vendor to furnish additional surety within ten (10) days from date of request shall be sufficient cause for the cancellation of the order.
- 13. When in the determination of the Director of Purchase, the articles or equipment delivered fail to meet Nassau Health Care Corporation specifications or, if in the determination of the Director of Purchase, the Vendor consistently fails to deliver as ordered, the Director of Purchase, reserves the right to cancel the order and purchase the balance from other sources at the Vendor's expense.
- 14. Delivery must be made as ordered and in accordance with the bid. If delivery instructions do not appear on order, it will be interpreted to mean prompt delivery. The decision of the Director of Purchase, as to reasonable compliance with delivery terms shall be final. Burden of proof of delay in receipt of order shall rest with the
- 15. The Nassau University Medical Center will not schedule any deliveries for Saturdays,

- Sundays or Legal Holidays, except commodities required for daily consumption or where the delivery is an emergency, a replacement, or is overdue, in which event the convenience of the Agency will govern.
- 16. Supplies shall be securely and properly packed for shipment, according to accepted commercial practice, without extra charge for packing cases, reels, bailing or sacks, the containers to remain the property of the Agency unless definitely stated otherwise in the bid.
- 17. The Vendor shall be responsible for delivery of supplies in good condition at point of destination. The Vendor shall file all claims with carrier for breakage, imperfections and other losses, which will be deducted from invoices. The receiving Agency will note for the benefit of Vendor when packages are not received in good condition.
- 18. All supplies which are customarily labeled or identified must have securely affixed thereto the original unmutilated label or marking of the manufacturer.
- 19. Billings for deliveries must be submitted in detail to Accounts Payable.
- 20. Furniture, machines, and other equipment must be delivered, installed and set in place as directed, ready for use unless otherwise specified.
- 21. Deliveries are subject to reweighing at destination by the Nassau Health Care Corporation and payment will be made on the basis of net weight of materials delivered. Normal shrinkage will be allowed in such instances where shrinkage is possible. Short weight shall be sufficient cause for cancellation of order at Vendor's expense.
- 22. GUARANTEES BY BIDDER Bidder hereby guarantees: (a) To save the Nassau Health Care Corporation, its' agents and employees harmless from liability of any nature or kind for the use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted composition, secret process, patented or unpatented invention, article or appliance furnished or used in the performance hereof of which the Bidder is not the Patentee, assignee or licensee, and to defend any action brought against the Nassau Health Care Corporation in the name of the Nassau Health Care Corporation and under the direction of the Nassau Health Care Corporation Attorney at the sole cost of the Bidder or in the sole option of the Director of Purchase, to pay the cost of such defense to the Nassau Health Care Corporation.
- (b) His products against defective material or workmanship and to repair or replace any damages or marring occasioned in transit.

Relevant Only During Hospital Construction and Remodeling

1. Purpose

To prevent the airborne spread of fungal spores, which may cause disease in susceptible individuals, during hospital construction, demolition, and remodeling activities. Construction / renovation require substantial planning to minimize the risk of airborne infection both during projects and after their completion. A multidisciplinary team coordinates Fire Safety and Infection Control risk assessments.

2. Construction / Remodeling Coordination Team

- A The team considers the following prior to initiating any construction or repair activity:
 - 1. Design and function of the new structure.
 - 2. Assessment of environmental risks for airborne disease and opportunities for prevention.
 - 3. Measures to contain dust and moisture during construction.
- B The following disciplines are included:
 - 1. Engineering Department
 - 2. Medical Director and Manager of the involved and adjacent patient care areas
 - 3. Safety and Security Department
 - 4. Infection Control Department
 - 5. Planning Department / Architects
 - 6. Project Managers
- C Responsibility and Accountability
 - 1. Coordinate members' input in developing a comprehensive project management plan.
 - 2. Conduct a risk assessment of the project to determine potential hazards to susceptible patients.
 - 3. Prevent unnecessary exposure of patients, visitors and staff.
 - 4. Oversee all infection control aspects of construction activities
 - 5. Establish site-specific infection control protocols for specialized areas.

TAX LAW § 5-A

Tax Law § 5-a, is effective with all solicitations to purchase issued by covered agencies on or after January 1, 2005. It applies to contracts where (1) the total amount of such persons' sales delivered into New York State are in excess of \$300,000 for the four quarterly periods immediately preceding the quarterly period in which the certification is made, and with respect to any affiliates, subcontractors, or affiliates of subcontractors whose sales delivered into New York State exceeded \$300,000 for the four quarterly periods immediately preceding the quarterly period in which the certification is made, and (2) the contracts or agreements with state agencies or public authorities for the sale of commodities or services have a value in excess of \$15,000. This law imposes upon certain contractors the obligation to certify whether or not the contractor, its affiliates, its subcontractors and affiliates of the subcontractors are required to register to collect state sales and compensating use tax. Where required to register, the contractor must also certify that it is, in fact, registered with the Department of Taxation and Finance (DTF). The law prohibits the Comptroller, or other approving agency, from approving a contract awarded to a vendor meeting the registration requirements but who is not so registered in accordance with the law.

Contractor certification forms and instructions for completing the forms are attached to this bid. Proposed contractors should complete and return the certification forms within two business days of request (if the forms are not completed and returned with bid submission). Failure to respond timely may render a bidder non-responsive and non-responsible. Bidders shall take the necessary steps to provide properly certified forms, within a timely manner to ensure compliance with the law.

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Instructions

General information

On August 20, 2004, New York State enacted section 5-a of the Tax Law requiring persons awarded contracts valued at more than \$15,000 with state agencies, public authorities or public benefit corporations to certify that they, their affiliates, their subcontractors, and the affiliates of their subcontractors have a valid certificate of authority to collect New York State and local sales and compensating use taxes. A contractor, affiliate, subcontractor or affiliate of a subcontractor must be certified as having a valid certificate of authority if such person makes, or has made, aggregate sales delivered within New York State of more than \$300,000 during the four quarterly periods ending on the last day of February, May, August, and November which immediately precede the quarterly period in which this certification is made. A contractor must use Form ST-220, Contractor Certification, to make this certification before the contract may be approved by the Office of the State Comptroller (OSC), or other contract approver if OSC is not required to approve the contract.

This statute applies to contracts resulting from solicitations to purchase issued by governmental entities on or after January 1, 2005. In the case of contracts resulting from issuance of an invitation for bid (IFB) or a request for proposal (RFP), the statute would apply if the IFB or RFP was first issued on or after January 1, 2005. The statute would not apply if the bid document was first issued before January 1, 2005, even if the bid document was amended, or the resulting contract was awarded, approved, amended, or extended after January 1, 2005.

The statute does not apply to purchases from preferred sources. For additional information, please see Publication 222, *Questions and Answers Concerning Tax Law Section 5-a.*

Definition of terms associated with section 5-a

The following is a partial list. Please see Publication 222 for additional information.

A contractor is defined as a person awarded a contract by a covered agency.

The term *person* is defined as any entity in business for either profit or notfor-profit purposes and can refer to an individual, partnership, limited liability company, society, association, joint stock company, or corporation.

A *covered agency* is defined as New York State or any department, board, bureau, commission, division, office, council or agency of New York State; public authorities and public benefit corporations. The State Legislature, the judiciary, Department of Law, Office of State Comptroller, State Education Department, State University of New York and the senior colleges of City University of New York are included in this definition.

An *affiliate* is an entity which, through stock ownership or any other affiliation, directly, indirectly or constructively, controls another entity, is controlled by another entity, or is, along with another entity, under the control of a common parent company.

A *subcontractor* is an entity specifically engaged by a contractor or another subcontractor to provide commodities or perform services necessary to allow a contractor to fulfill a particular contract with a covered agency.

Commodities means, other than with respect to contracts for State printing, material goods, supplies, products, construction items or other standard articles of commerce other than technology which are the subject of any purchase or other exchange.

Tangible personal property means physical personal property, of any nature, that has a material existence and is perceptible to the human senses. Tangible personal property includes, without limitation: (1) raw materials, such as wood, metal, rubber and minerals; (2) manufactured items, such as gasoline, oil, diesel motor fuel and kero-jet fuel, chemicals, jewelry, furniture, machinery and equipment, parts, tools, supplies, computers, clothing, motor vehicles, boats, yachts, appliances, lighting fixtures, building materials; (3) pre-written off-the-shelf software; (4) artistic items such as sketches, paintings, photographs, moving picture films and recordings; (5) animals, trees, shrubs, plants and seeds;

- (6) bottled water, soda and beer; (7) candy and confections;
- (8) cigarettes and tobacco products; (9) cosmetics and toiletries;
- (10) coins and other numismatic items, when purchased for purposes other than for use as a medium of exchange;
- (11) postage stamps, when purchased for purposes other than mailing; and
- (12) precious metals in the form of bullion, ingots, wafers and other forms.

Completing Form ST-220 Identification information

Contractor name: Enter the exact legal name of the person or entity who is contracting to provide commodities or services to a covered agency of New York State. This is the name registered with the New York Department of State

Contractor's principal place of business: Enter a street address, not a PO box number.

Mailing address: Enter the address where contractor receives mail, if different than the principal place of business.

Contracting state agency: Enter the state agency awarding the contract to the contractor.

Certification statement: If the contractor is a corporation, the statement must be completed by the president, vice president, treasurer, assistant treasurer, chief accounting officer, or other officer authorized by the corporation. If the contractor is a partnership, the statement must be completed by a partner or person authorized by the partnership. If the contractor is a limited liability company, the statement must be completed by a member of the LLC and be authorized by the LLC.

Part I - Contract services not pursuant to Tax Law section 5-a

If the services to be performed under the contract are not services within the meaning of Tax Law section 5-a, mark an *X*. You do not have to complete Parts II through V. You must sign and have the certification acknowledged.

 - i. Vendor is to park only in designated locations as directed by the Environmental Services, Grounds, and Public Safety personnel.
- f. Quotations/estimates
 - i. The Vendor shall submit estimates to the NHCC Corporation representative requesting the services. The estimate will then be reviewed, and if approved, a Delivery Order will be issued to the Vendor.

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<u>NO</u> supplies or work is to begin, or product to be shipped/received, until a Purchase Order has been issued by NHCC and received by the Vendor.

g. Billing/invoices

- i. Supplies shall be as listed in pricing section Plan "A" and Plan "B".
- ii. Supplies sold under Plan "A" will be invoiced at the contract prices.
- iii. Supplies sold under Plan "B" shall be at a percentage discount from the manufacturer's list price or shall be at a mark-up over cost, which will require the Vendor to submit proof of purchase and price paid with the invoice.
- iv. Supplies rented under Plan "C"
- v. Invoices shall be presented to the NHCC Coordinator. Invoices shall include:
 - 1. List price or Vendor cost
 - 2. Discount or mark-up over cost

- h. NHCC reserves right to add or delete products at any time during the contract period by providing thirty (30) days written notice to the Vendor. An amendment to the contract will be issued reflecting the changes and/or requests made.
- i. Vendor warrants that all materials, equipment, and/or services provided under the blanket purchase order shall be fit for the purpose(s) for which intended, and that products or services conform to the requirements and specifications herein. See the warranty information require in section V.

IV. Pricing

It is The intent of the NuHealth Corporation to issue a multi-year contract for maintenance, service, repairs, supplies, parts, materials, equipment, rentals of emergency back-up or standby units, for all types of gas and diesel generators for use at Nassau University Medical Center and all of its facilities. The vendor must be trained and authorized for all types of generators used at NHCC. Factory direct training certificates shall be provided. The vendor shall be able to respond and make repairs 24hours a day 7 days a week and be on site within 2 hours of being notified. The vendor shall supply all fluids, filters, gaskets, light bulbs, oil, coolant, and minor parts/fluids specified by OEM recommendations at the time of service or PMs.

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Annual pricing will include the maintenance/service program for each unit and will include but not limited all required semiannual scheduled services based on OEM recommendations. These tests and checks will be performed when the generators are in standby mode and when fully operational/running.

Engine Lubrication

Check, test, tighten, clean, witness and inspect oil levels and top off or change if needed all parts and equipment of the engine lubricating systems including auxiliary oil tanks, connections, gaskets, filters, pumps, governors and piping. Engine oil and all fluids shall be supplied by vendor and used at the time of service. Also test oil for evidence of dilution or contamination and act accordingly. Inspect for leaks check and record oil pressures at operating temperature (while running). Inspect and change all filters, check for leaks and change filter as per OEM recommendations, when needed or semiannual and supplied by vendor during PM's. Draw an oil sample for spectro-chemicals/physical property to a Detroit Diesel Oil Analysis lab test and report findings in writing to NUMC staff. Engine Fuel Systems

Check, test, tighten, clean, add too, witness and inspect all parts and equipment of the fuel supply systems, check manifold for leaks, overall condition and tightness of all fittings, filters etc. Check, inspect and witness the operations of all fuel transfer pumps, pipes and fittings. Check, inspect, lubricate and witness the operations of governor actuator fuel rack, ball joints and all parts of the fuel systems. Record fuel pressures; make adjustments and repairs if needed. All parts requiring lubrication and gasket changes are replaced/conducted. Maintain records and logs as required on site or in the Engineering office. Change filters as per OEM recommendations, also test fuel for evidence of dilution, contamination and quality/specific gravity and act/report accordingly. Reports and issues with the fuel or any of its parts/operations are acted upon and reported/documented. All parts of the system should be left clean, neat, free from leaks and ready for emergency use.

Engine Air Systems

Check, inspect, tighten, clean and witness the operations all parts of the air system, including but not limited to louvers, duct work, turbo outlet hoses, pipes, clamps, brackets air box dampers, fan and fan drive systems, stack dampers, crankcase breathers, air box drains, air filter, air intake screen, heater, clamps, bushings, and fittings. Lubricate, change and tighten all parts and filters as per OEM recommendations. Start the engine and listen for unusual engine and turbine (blower) sounds/noises. Check exhaust stack for proper operation. Reports and issues with the air system or any of its parts/operations are acted upon and reported/documented to NUMC staff in writing. Maintain records and logs as required on site or in the Engineering office. All parts of the system should be left clean, neat, free from leaks and ready for emergency use.

Engine Cooling Systems

Check, inspect, test, tighten, clean, add to, lubricate and witness the operations all parts of the cooling system, including but not limited to coolant, pipes, clamps, brackets, radiators, radiators cores, hoses, fan shrouds, guards, fan drive belts, fittings, belts, idler, fan drive bearings, thermostats gauges and covers. Pressure test coolant system to 15psi and record findings and take corrective actions, add freeze protection, all fluids, parts and filters shall be provided by the vendor at the time of the service, check and record all functions of the cooling system when not running as well as when in operation. Reports and issues with the cooling system or any of its

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parts/operations are acted upon and reported/documented to NUMC staff in writing. Maintain records and logs as required at site or in the Engineering office. All parts of the system should be left clean, neat, free from leaks and ready for emergency use.

Engine Electrical Systems

Check, inspect, test, tighten, clean, lubricate and witness the operations all parts of the electrical system, including but not limited to starters, cables, battery's, chargers, controllers, gauges, indicator lights or mechanisms, sensors, thermostats, switches, thermocouple, oil pressure disconnect contactor, check generator/engine cabinets for discolored connections and failed relay appearance, cable MP unit, solenoids and solenoid contactors, fittings/connections, contactors, safety devices, emergency lighting and access and rack area. Load test starter battery's to 450 amps/cell for 15 seconds and record, overspeed trip setting, valve lash adjusters, governor rack settings, valve and injector timing, voltage regulators, all relays, exciter generator, slip rings and brushes, meter, panels, check and record starting battery float voltage and electrolyte level. Reports and issues with the electrical system or any of its parts/operations are acted upon and reported/documented to NUMC staff in writing. Maintain records and logs as required at site or in the Engineering office. All parts of the system should be left clean, neat, free from leaks and ready for emergency use.

Engine/Generator Mechanical/Other Electrical Systems

Check, inspect, test, tighten, clean, lubricate and witness the operations all parts of the mechanical unit and other electrical systems including but not limited to, mounting bolts, cylinder head mechanism, positions of the unit and bus metering, circuit breakers, indicator lights, synchronized performance during auto start, protective devices, drive flex fastening bolts, all bearings, mechanical connections, and look for stress factors in all supports/mounting. Check and record residual, no load and full load volts. Inspect the exciter assembly, stator, and field for operations, cleanliness and physical integrity. Inspect rotating rectifier and surge suppressor for overall condition, connections and routine tightness. Inspect end bell enclosure for cleanliness and device interference with rotating assemblies. Reports and issues with the electrical system or any of its parts/operations are acted upon and reported/documented to NUMC staff in writing. Maintain records and logs as required at site or in the Engineering office. All parts of the system should be left clean, neat, free from leaks and ready for emergency use.

Generator Control Systems

Check, inspect, test, tighten, clean, lubricate and witness the operations of all controllers' parts of the starter systems including but not limited to the operation of the auto starter and remote controls. Check the operations and accuracy of the generator and engine instruments, generator set, associated, indicators, lights and alarms. Adjust system frequency and voltages and adjust synchronized kilowatt and reactive load sharing controls. Reports and issues with the control systems or any of its parts/operations are acted upon and reported/documented to NUMC staff in writing. Maintain records and logs as required at site or in the Engineering office. All parts of the system should be left clean, neat, free from leaks and ready for emergency use.


