MIROTZNIK: May I have a 2 motion to open up the Executive 3 Committee of the Board of the Nassau 4 Health Care Corporation for 5 August 24th, 2017? May I have a hand 6 motion? Motion to open it. Motion 7 carries. 8 Brief report, Dr. Politi, 9 congratulations. 10 Thank you, sir. DR. POLITI: 11 Your MR. MIROTZNIK: 12 accomplishments as exhibited by A and B 13 annexed to the records speak for 14 themselves, and again, from the Board 1.5 and myself, your staff, and those who 16 work very hard, we wish you the best of 17 luck in the endeavors beginning August 18 31st, 2017, 12:01 a.m. 19 DR. POLITI: Thank you, 20 Mr. Chairman. 21 MR. MIROTZNIK: Dr. Politi, is 22 there anything, report, item number 23 three? 24 DR. POLITI: I will let my report 25

August 24, 2017 1 2 stand. MR. MIROTZNIK: So noted. 3 Ms. Reed, Compensation Committee? 4 report other than what we just had? 5 MS. REED: Just what we had. 6 7 Thank you. MR. MIROTZNIK: So moving right 8 along. With regard to the resolution, 9 I will read into the record: The Board 10 of Directors of NHCC direct an 11 execution of an amendment to the 12 existing contract with 13 Victor F. Politi, M.D. and 14 NuHealth/Nassau Health Care 15 Corporation, NHCC, renewing Dr. Politi 16 as the President/CEO of NuHealth/Nassau 17 Health Care Corporation, effective as 18 of July 1st, 2017, through 19 December 31st, 2019. 20 Additionally, the base salary set 21 forth in section one of the existing 22 agreement shall be increased to an 23 annual rate in the amount of \$368,387. 2.4 May I have a motion? Ms. Reed, 25

myself, Dr. Caruso, Mr. Kalotee and Mr. DeLuca. Motion to second? All in favor? Same hand votes. Record one member nonvoting. Any other business?

MR. KALOTEE: Chairman, may I have your permission? I want to say congratulations to Dr. Politi and the Board.

I have a lot of trust in you, the Board, expecting you to do the best, what you are already doing but better, and that better is because you have another responsibility of the jail.

Hopefully we will not need all the same employees that was working in there, over there will be changed, changed with the hospital. Under your leadership I'm sure you will show the Board that there will be a change.

DR. POLITI: Yes, sir. We will continue moving forward and making this the finest healthcare institution in Nassau County.

MR. KALOTEE: Thank you, sir, and

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MR. MIROTZNIK: Congratulations, Doctor. Mr. Nicholson, we are under public comments. Would you like to

MR. NICHOLSON: Quickly, yes. Two minutes of your time. This is going to be really quick, because as usual, I'm a day late and a dollar

First of all, Dr. Politi's aware of this, and I want to make the Board aware of it and everybody in the room. CSEA is committed within the next couple of weeks to put forward about a quarter of a million dollars in advertising for Nassau Health Care Corporation.

We are going to be doing a series of commercials specifically aimed at Nassau Health Care Corporation and the great stuff that is going on here.

What I was going to speak about in public comments, but after speaking

August 24, 2017 1 with Maureen and Mr. Zysman, and a 2 couple of other members of the Board, 3 was transactions. Personnel transactions for my members, seemed to 5 be moving forward at a very glacial 6 pace lately. A day late, dollar short, because I found out that there have been 9 several transactions that have recently 10 been approved at the last Board 11 meeting, which I was not at. 12 Mr. Ciampoli is going to give me 13 a copy of those transactions tomorrow. 14 So I want to thank Dr. Politi, and the 15 Board, and HR, who we always work 16 17 really well with. MR. MIROTZNIK: Are you 1.8 withdrawing the glacial term? 19 MR. NICHOLSON: No. 20 MR. MIROTZNIK: Are you going to 21 keep glacial? 22 MR. NICHOLSON: I'm going to keep 23 glacial, yes. It's good for my heart. 24 MR. MIROTZNIK: Mr. Nicholson, we 2.5

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have had a good relationship these last few years. I want you to know our last meeting, which was the 11th, it was organized at a rapid speed and pace because Dr. Politi had a number of items on an agenda that needed to get done and approved in order to transition with the jail healthcare.

As you are aware, there was a huge list Maureen provided you with, a list of personnel, and I think those are the personnel --

MR. NICHOLSON: Those were other personnel transactions separate and apart from the jail transactions, but they are being handled as well, from what I am being told.

MR. MIROTZNIK: You are satisfied with what is happening?

MR. NICHOLSON: For today.

MR. MIROTZNIK: Mr. DeLuca?

MR. DELUCA: May I make a quick comment, Mr. Chairman, to
Mr. Nicholson?

MR. MIROTZNIK: About the glacial pace?

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MR. DELUCA: Your endeavors are really well taken, because I think the residents in Nassau County will really benefit from any type of ads or commercials that you do, because truly our emergency room in the hospital is one of the best in Nassau County, and it's one of the few that doesn't have curtains that separate patients. We have our own rooms.

So in terms of infection, and in terms of privacy, that's incredible, and I know the people that I have recommended to come here, they all came back and said what incredible care they have gotten.

So I think what you have done is going to be a real asset to the people in Nassau. Thank you.

MR. MIROTZNIK: Mr. Kalotee?

MR. KALOTEE: Thank you,

Chairman. Again, I'm a big supporter

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of the union. As you guys are very well aware of, as you know, they recently just now voted to continue Dr. Politi's contract because he is the boss.

He is the head of the organization. He can't do the job until he have the tools, which he just got them.

Same time, Dr. Politi needs all your guys' help to achieve the goal of the public, the best interest, and I hope we all work together for the best interest of the hospital and the patients who come here.

chairman, one thing I do like to ask if it's okay, the next time, no matter what the contract comes up, please make sure all the board members get at least one week in advance so they know what they are voting for, so they have the time to read, so they can vote educationally and intelligently, so nobody can say that we didn't read

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it and we voted for it.

Of course, in Dr. Politi's case, his record, it was very well taken by all of the Board members, but next time I do humbly request everybody, every board member, should receive any contract in advance at least to five days.

MR. MIROTZNIK: Board secretary, you have your work cut out for you. We try to adhere to that deadline as best as humanly possible.

So everyone knows, starting
September, we anticipate every month
following that, the first Thursday of
the month, God willing with scheduling,
and health, and everything else, that
we will all be able to convene at a
weekly-agreed upon time, but for every
Thursday for the calendar year through
the end of the year, certainly please
have that penciled in. So we will have
a meeting.

I'm sure there will be a number

August 24, 2017 1 of things, Dr. Politi, that will come 2 up with regard to jail issues and with 3 regard to this institution and Mr. Nicholson, whatever you need that 5 we can help you with, please keep to 6 that schedule as well. 7 MR. NICHOLSON: Thank you for 8 your recognition, Mr. Chairman. 9 MR. MIROTZNIK: Any other public 10 comments? Mr. Clines? Mr. Clines, we 11. do have a stenographer, so do it 12 slowly. 13 14 15

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MR. CLINES: I understand that and I will endeavor to be slow enough to be taken down by the stenographer.

First, I would request on behalf of the minority leader that we be given a copy of the contract as amended with Dr. Politi.

I wonder if we could have that tonight, if someone could run off the copy of that?

MR. MIROTZNIK: That assumes it has already been drafted.

August 24, 2017 1 MS. RYAN: There is no contract 2 that was drafted. The terms were just 3 voted on now. When there is a 4 contract, it --5 MR. CLINES: Will the Board be 6 voting on the actual contract? 7 MS. RYAN: They just voted on the 8 terms of the contract. 9 MR. CLINES: It's customary? 10 MR. CIAMPOLI: The practice, 11 Peter, is that the Board authorizes the 12 preparation and execution of a 13 contract. 14 MR. CLINES: May I ask on behalf 1.5 of the public and the minority leader 16 if in addition to the base 17 compensation, if there is any 18 additional compensation? 19 MR. MIROTZNIK: Over and above 20 the base? 21 MS. RYAN: No. 22 MR. CIAMPOLI: What you can get, 23 and I think this may answer your 24 question, you can get the existing 25

August 24, 2017 1 contract. That's in the public domain. 2 We can get that to you, maybe not 3 tonight, but as soon as possible. 4 You heard on the record here 5 exactly what terms of the contract are 6 changed. MR. CLINES: So I don't know 8 what's in the current contract, so that 9 doesn't give me a lot of information. 10 MR. CIAMPOLI: That will --11 MR. CLINES: Can I ask if there 12 will be additional compensation? 13 MR. CIAMPOLI: I don't believe 14 there is, but I'm not going to tell you 15 until I have the document in my hands 16 and I can tell you, and I don't have 17 that document in my hand. 18 MR. CLINES: Can I ask if there 19 are renewal periods for the contract? 20 MR. CIAMPOLI: To the best of my 21 recollection there is a provision in 22 the contract by which the Board, if 23 they are not going to renew, must 24 provide notice to Dr. Politi. 25

August 24, 2017 1 If they fail to act, the contract 2 is up automatically for renewal. 3 MR. CLINES: May I ask the terms 4 for the automatically-renewed contract? 5 MR. CIAMPOLI: You heard that 6 7 tonight. 8 MR. CLINES: I may have missed it. 9 MR. MIROTZNIK: Let's make it 10 easy. Mr. Clines, you want a copy of 11 the contract when he executes it and 12 you also want a copy of the existing 13 contract as it exists tonight? 14 MR. CLINES: Yes, and if there is 15 a terms sheet, the --16 MR. MIROTZNIK: There is no term 17 sheet. 18 MR. CLINES: I heard a Board 19 member talk about what sounded like a 2.0 late circulation of the contract to 21 Board members, so there must be 22 23 something --MR. MIROTZNIK: I don't believe 24 that's what Mr. Kalotee said. 25

KALOTEE: What I said is I 2 would ask for a copy of whatever 3 written directive of the term of the 4 contract, that the Board had before voted, and disclosure of when it 6 received those --MR. MIROTZNIK: Mr. Clines, you 8 want Dr. Politi's current contract that 9 is in full force and effect as we sit 10 here now? 11 MR. CLINES: That's one thing. 12 MR. MIROTZNIK: Got it. Second 13 thing is you want the new contract when 14 it's fully executed, a copy of the 15 contract that we voted on tonight? 16 MR. CLINES: That's also what I 17 would like. 18 MR. CIAMPOLI: You are looking 19 for the resolution that was adopted 20 tonight. 21 MR. CLINES: If there is 22 something else, I would like it. 23 MR. CIAMPOLI: There is nothing 24 else that I know of. If there is, I 25

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will look under the paper for it.

MR. KALOTEE: Whatever is in the public record, we have, we just provide it.

MR. CLINES: If there is something not in the public record, at least the minority leader should be able to see it in --

MR. MIROTZNIK: There is nothing.

MR. CLINES: With respect to comment, I don't think I need to say that the comments and the allegations of Mr. Zysman are very troubling, to say the least.

Threats and intimidation, I'm not taking them as true or not true, but threats and intimidation are serious allegations to make in connection with a contract of this importance to this crucial an institution to Nassau County.

I don't think the Board can gloss them over and enter into a contract without further inquiry. So I think it

would be appropriate for the Board to consider at least suspending the effect of it's vote and arranging for an independent investigation into these allegations to make sure that the public can have confidence in the vote that was taken tonight.

MR. KALOTEE: There was no threat to anyone and I can assure you there is no threat. We are here. We are sent here by the legislature to do the public work, and if in communications somebody feel differently, I said it on the record, and I say it again, we are here to do the public work.

If I made the comment a little to the public work and someone felt differently, that they could ask me and I would explain, but if they didn't, I feel sorry again, but there was no threat of any kind.

MR. CLINES: I respect your position --

MR. KALOTEE: Thank you, sir.

MR. CLINES: -- but the public position here is important, that everything is done in a regular and proper manner.

I would suggest that further inquiry needs to happen and I'm surprised that the Board is willing to vote when the statement was made on the record without further inquiry with regard to what I had said earlier regarding importance of this contract and the fact that it's been entered into on the eve of an election.

I stand by those contracts. I think Dr. Politi's list of accomplishments was very impressive. I think someone of this caliber would be a strong candidate of approval by whoever is elected to county executive.

So I would urge the Board to reconsider it's decision and await the people speaking through the electoral process, and giving the new county executive, whoever that is, the

opportunity to say I approve or disapprove.

Someone with the record of

Dr. Politi shouldn't be concerned about
that, and I just reiterate my earlier
comments made on the record prior to
executive session, and I thank you for
your patience in hearing me out.

MR. MIROTZNIK: Mr. Clines, I understand you and Mr. Ciampoli know each other on a first-name basis?

MR. CLINES: Yes, we do.

MR. MIROTZNIK: So with the decorum that we are having and the respect, I think Mr. Ciampoli's obligation and his job duties are to respond to some of your comments, rather than individual members of the Board regarding the legalities and the intricacies of the current contract that's in play. So with that --

MR. CLINES: I'm all ears.

MR. MIROTZNIK: Mr. Ciampoli?

MR. CIAMPOLI: Peter, number one,

August 24, 2017 1 I want to thank you for your 2 self-correcting metronome here, because 3 previously you had said that the county 4 executive appointed -- that was 5 discussed. 6 MR. CLINES: I withdraw that. MR. CIAMPOLI: You corrected 8 yourself. He approves the appointment. 9 The power to appointment is with this 10 Board. 11 MR. MIROTZNIK: So you made a boo 12 boo and he is correcting it? I want to 13 know who is correct. 14 MR. CLINES: I thought I said 15 approve, but if I said appoints, then I 16 stand corrected. 17 MR. CIAMPOLI: The first time you 18 said appoints. That time you said 19 approved. So I thank you for that, 20 because there was some concern among 21 the Board members, and we went back to 22 the document. Our bylaws --23 MR. CLINES: And it's in the 24 statute. 25

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MR. CIAMPOLI: I also want to thank you, and I will thank you, on behalf of Dr. Politi, that you have just said to us that in effect someone with Dr. Politi's background and accomplishments, it would make no difference what the county executive said, if approving what this Board did.

MR. CLINES: I didn't say that.

MR. CIAMPOLI: Not quite.

MR. CLINES: I said with those accomplishments he shouldn't be afraid to have his name subject to approval by the new executive.

MR. CIAMPOLI: I will tell you that this Board took a vote in executive session, as it was entitled to do so. They came out here. They repeated the vote not once, but twice, because unfortunately the chair wasn't watching me wave at her and she didn't do a motion first.

We are about doing things right here. We always try that, and I will

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segue into your concerns about other people's concerns. Mr. Zysman is a dear friend of mine. Bobby Kalotee has been a friend of mine for years and years. I have had the privilege of representing this man in court.

It is my sincere hope, I think it is the sincere hope of everybody in the room, that my friends will get along with my friends, because it will make things work better here, and run better here.

That is what this Board, in my direct experience serving as counsel, has as it's mission and it's goal, and that is to do things right, so that we can run this hospital as best it can be run and provide the best services to the citizens of this county.

I'm going to tell you this, and
I'm going to ask you to do me a favor:
Do not leave this room and politicize
the actions tonight. It was not
political.

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As you agreed, Dr. Politi has a great deal of accomplishments. I worked with him when he was Police Commissioner. I worked with him when he was Deputy County Executive and I have a great deal of respect for Dr. Politi.

I have a great deal of respect for everyone who sits on this Board. We are all individuals. We are all people.

There are times that we have some rough spots. There are times we have some misunderstandings. You and I know some of the times that we had when we worked together in the county attorney's office. It happens.

It should not be, in the interest of the citizens of this county, be politicized, be exploited politically.

You may not like the idea that an appointment was made tonight, but this Board acted entirely within it's powers under the law and did so in a proper

August 24, 2017 1 2 fashion. MR. MIROTZNIK: Mr. Ciampoli, 3 before you address anything you have to, what I wanted you to address was 5 the various intricacies of the 6 7 contract. So if this Board does nothing, 8 what happens tonight? When the 9 milestones are reached, if the Board 10 does something, et cetera, et cetera. 11 12 So there are certain things that the Board has to do or not do. 13 Irrespective of what was done tonight, 14 there would have been, by inaction, a 15 16 self-executing term on the existing contract, which was the same, in my 17 understanding, I wasn't here, the same 18 contract that the predecessor of our 19 CEO Arthur Gianelli had. 20 MR. CLINES: I have no way of 21 knowing whether that's accurate or not. 2.2 23 MR. MIROTZNIK: Well, I wouldn't tell you something that wasn't 24 25 accurate.

MR. CLINES: People can have different views of things.

MR. MIROTZNIK: It is a document.

MR. CIAMPOLI: Peter, you will receive those documents. You will see that this contract is the same, except for what was adopted here tonight in terms of the terms of the agreement.

The prior contract that this is based on was approved by the Board during Dr. Gianelli's tenure.

MR. CLINES: I appreciate your willingness to disclose the documents, and we will review them when we get them.

None of this is personal with respect to any member of the Board, but this is a public body and some troubling allegations were made and --

MR. KALOTEE: I have to say I did not call anybody to say how to vote and not to vote. I want to make that clear on the record. I did not suggest anybody how to vote and how not to

August 24, 2017 1 vote. 2 MR. MIROTZNIK: Peter --3 MR. CLINES: I think I've said my 4 5 piece. MR. MIROTZNIK: I didn't memorize 6 Arthur Gianelli's contract, but 7 whatever it is, you will get --8 MR. CLINES: I'm not interested 9 in deliberately misrepresenting 10 anything. Like you say, the document 11 is the document. 12 MR. MIROTZNIK: We will get you 13 Dr. Politi's existing. We will get you 14 the new one pursuant to the vote this 15 evening. Anything else that you need, 16 reasonable request, I'm sure 17 Mr. Ciampoli and Mr. Clines can work 18 out whatever he needs. 19 MR. CLINES: I do just want to 20 say that John's characterization of 21 what I said was not 100 percent 22 accurate, in my view. 23 I do think it makes a big 24 difference giving the new county 25

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executive a chance to approve or disapprove the CEO of this institution.

Dr. Politi did a very thorough job in describing the importance of this institution, and I think that makes the point for me as to why the new county executive should have the role in choosing the guiding hand as this institution goes into the future.

MR. KALOTEE: Again, I want to say I did not speak to anybody how to vote and how not to vote. I did not speak to anybody.

I stand for what I believe in, but my responsibility is as the Board member to what is right, what is the best interest of the public, or the best interest of the hospital.

I stand for firmly how I vote.

Every other Board member have their right to do what they choose to do. I did not speak to anybody and I do not tell anybody what to do and what not to do.

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MR. MIROTZNIK: Anything else, Mr. Clines?

MR. CLINES: Thank you for the opportunity to speak.

DR. CARUSO: Let me just add one thing, only that I do take one offense, is that what I was voting for tonight is a continuation of Dr. Politi, because he has done an excellent job, so far as I have seen.

More importantly, besides the politics of whoever gets elected as county executive, it's important that we are taking over the jail.

The jail has been a disaster. I know that the county took the jail over the first time to take over health services in the jail, and I don't think it went well.

So I don't think you can put politics into taking care of all the inmates and patients, and all the patients in this facility and Nassau County, because that person's going to

August 24, 2017 1 take a long time to figure out what to do with Nassau County Medical Center, 3 4 or NUMC. So I think it's very important 5 that stability is the most important 6 thing, and the takeover of the jail is September 1st, August 31st, not 8 9 November and not January. So I think in the best interest 10 of the public it's important for us to 11 have a continuity of care and someone 12 on the team in charge. 13 (Clapping.) 14 15 16

DR. CARUSO: -- will do what he needs to do. With that said, I think we should call it a night.

MR. MIROTZNIK: One minute, Mr. Clines.

MR. CLINES: I'm not a Board member so I'm willing to let a Board member get the last word.

MR. MIROTZNIK: You don't have to, because us lawyers don't generally allow that. It's called gilding the

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But with regard to Dr. Caruso's comment, it is my pure understanding that when Dr. Politi appeared before the Nassau County Legislature, they worked very hard with your minority leader to accomplish what I understand to have been a unanimous house vote, probably one of the only unanimous votes you took in a long time; is that a fair recitation.

MR. CLINES: Yes. Although I'm not sure how it's relevant to --

MR. MIROTZNIK: You have

Dr. Politi sitting here, who worked

very diligently with both sides of the

aisle to accomplish an agreement that

was voted on by the legislature, and

also, from a little blurb I saw in the

paper, NIFA spent very little time,

gave it the thumbs up vote.

It's difficult for us as Board members to sit here and not show some support -- let me finish, please.

MR. CLINES: I didn't say a word, so please finish.

MR. MIROTZNIK: We are all volunteers. We are all volunteers. For this man to sit here and not have some stability for his career, and his life, and his family, as we all have families -- we have Dr. Saracino seated to my right. He doesn't need to come here. He's had a beautiful career outside of this institution.

We are all here because we believe in it, and at some time in the future we will all be gone and replaced with new people, and hopefully we hand over the baton at some point to people that care, and are diligent, and give up a lot of their family time to be here.

But for Dr. Politi, I firmly believe that he needs to have some assurance from this Board that all the work that he's undertaken to do, and will continue to do, has some

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recognition so he doesn't have to worry about looking for a new job immediately after.

You should know there are out clauses in the contract, which you will receive from Mr. Ciampoli. I was hoping somebody would address it.

I don't want to address it. I'm only a Board member and Chair. Let the lawyers who do this full-time do it. So you will look at it and you will see.

MR. CLINES: Of course we will look at it.

MR. MIROTZNIK: We do nothing, he gets a time period. We do something, he gets the same time period, and lastly, whomever sits in the seat in Mineola, they have the opportunity to address this man as if he is competent.

If he's not competent, or they have someone else, they really misunderstood the terms and conditions of his existing contract. More than

August 24, 2017 1 that, what else can we do for this 2 3 hospital? MR. CLINES: Just the jail 4 contract was not a referendum up or down on Dr. Politi and this shouldn't 6 be misconstrued as an attack on him. This is a defense of the spirit 8 of the law and the Democratic process, 9 and Dr. Politi is -- should be free to 10 make his case to the new county 11 executive, who should be free to decide 12 how this hospital will proceed into the 13 future, and that's our point. 14 MR. MIROTZNIK: How do you run a 15 hospital without somebody in the CEO 16 17 seat? MR. CLINES: Of course you can't. 18 No one is suggesting that you not have 19 someone in the CEO seat. 20 MR. MIROTZNIK: Anything else? 21 Anybody want to get the last word? 22 Peter, one more? 23 MR. CLINES: No, thank you. 24 MR. MIROTZNIK: Make a motion to 25
