MR. MIROTZNIK: Good morning,
everybody. I'd like to open the
Friday, August 1st, 2017 Nassau Health
Care Corporation full Executive
Committee meeting. Can I have a
motion? All in favor? Unanimous.

MR. DELUCA: Unless you see me put my hand up, don't put my name down as a vote yes, okay?

MR. MIROTZNIK: Do we have a vote to open up the meeting? Was there enough hands? It's unanimous, thank you.

First order of business, on a lighter note, I'd like to introduce somebody who may be well known to the administration here and some of the members of the Board, the honorable Bobby Kumar Kalotee.

It's an honor and a privilege at this ungodly hour to have Bobby to be present here. He is a former chairman of this Board. He has a lot of knowledge and history of the hospital.

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Without further ado, despite at little bit of a back and forth this morning before we started the meeting with timing, et cetera, I would like Bobby to say hello to everybody, and a couple of words at his discretion.

Good morning.

MR. KALOTEE: Thank you for your kind words, Mr. Chairman. Good morning, everybody. My very simple statement: I love this hospital. I love the people who work here.

The only reason I came back is because of my love to this hospital. I said it in the Nassau County when I was getting reappointed a third time. I have no loyalty to none of those people, except to the hospital and the people who work here, and the patients who come here.

I said that day, and I say it again, this hospital has helped so many people and never gets the credit. The credit is due. This hospital had saved

one of my own family members and that's what brought me the first time to this hospital.

No matter where you go, I don't think, and I am on so many boards in different hospitals, this hospital is the best to help the people when they are in need.

That love had brought me here and I'm here to fight for that love, do the right things by the people who come here, work, to serve the others and the patients.

I thank you very much for taking the time. I don't want to take time for more than that. Love of the hospital, I'm here. For the best interests of the hospital, I'm here. I have no other agenda.

In the past, today, or tomorrow, we misunderstood, just remember I am speaking from simply pure love for the hospital and the people who work here. Thank you.

August 11, 2017 1 MR. MIROTZNIK: Thank you, Bobby, 2 appreciate that. Call to order. First 3 matter on the agenda, the approval of 4 the Executive Committee minutes of the 5 executive session of February 6th, 2017 6 and June 15th, 2017. Can I have a 7 motion to approve those minutes? 8 MR. ZYSMAN: Motion. 9 MR. MIROTZNIK: All in favor? 10 11 No? MR. COHN: For the record, this 12 stack of papers, which is about four 13 inches off my desk, maybe five, was 14 given to me 10, 15 minutes ago. 15 I haven't had the opportunity to 16 read them. I can't be expected to 17 approve them, so I will abstain on the 18 19 approval. MR. KALOTEE: May I, Chairman? 20 MR. MIROTZNIK: Sure. 21 MR. KALOTEE: I will state for 22 the same, since I wasn't even supposed 23 to be here. I wasn't invited to this 24 meeting. I don't want to fault 25

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anybody. Whatever happens, I want to put it on the records.

No board member should be excluded from any meetings, regardless of if they are on the committee or not, or they can vote or not. The rules I know in the past, unless the rules are changed, every board member is allowed. They have fiduciary responsibility to attend every committee meeting, even if they cannot vote.

I was deprived that yesterday, and I was supposed to be deprived today. Thanks to the people who, just like me, love the hospital, they choose to inform me, and I do want to thank Mr. Warren Zysman, who called me last night to let me know, which was, I think, about 9:30 at night. Otherwise I would not be here, because I was deprived.

But as Mr. Steve Cohn said, we can't even glimpse all these papers in last ten seconds. How we can vote?

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How you expect us to vote? I think
this motion should be put on hold so we
can review them and we do whatever the
responsibility is to set the policy
correct.

So we don't know what is in it.

We don't know what's the agenda in it.

It will be illegal. It will be

deprived all other board members.

Even if you have the majority to pass it, my humble advice is unless something is so essential, it is important for the hospital, then we must carry on that, because it's important.

Otherwise, you cannot do your job as a Chairman, and we don't want you to feel what also the board members should not feel, but they should have the chance to review it.

Please do not ask any board
member to vote on this until they
review it, because if they're voting
for it, and they don't know what is in

August 11, 2017 1 it, I think that's also wrong. 2 So my humble advice is if 3 something is very essential and 4 important for the best interest of the 5 hospital and the patients, we should 6 single out that particular item. 7 rest should be tabled until we review 8 it for the next meeting. Thank you. 9 MR. MIROTZNIK: Mr. Zysman? 10 MR. ZYSMAN: I had a conversation 11 with Dr. Politi yesterday. He informed 12 myself that both Contracts, as well as 13 the Finance, was an important issue 14 that needed to be done. He sent 15 e-mails about that. 16 I would say that we should take a 17 look at those two areas and vote on 18 19 those minutes today. MR. KALOTEE: Can you let us know 20 what page and what it is? 21 MR. ZYSMAN: Sure. Number eight 22 and number ten of the agenda. Number 23 eight, there are three sets of minutes 24 to be approved under Finance. 25

August 11, 2017 1 There is also an area of Position 2 Control, which is the part that 3 Dr. Politi referred to yesterday that 4 he needs certain key positions to come 5 in, and the approval of these minutes 6 are critical to be able to do that. 7 MR. KALOTEE: Are we only 8 approving the minutes, or are we 9 approving something else? You said 10 it's a minute. 11 I have no problem approving the 12 minutes, as long as it's not strictly 13 approving something else. So there's a 14 difference between the minutes or --1.5 MR. COHN: The underlying 16 17 actions? MR. KALOTEE: Yes. 18 MR. ZYSMAN: Well, we can give 19 Dr. Politi a call. 20 MR. KALOTEE: No, no. I will not 21 call him. I'm asking you, since --22 MR. ZYSMAN: This is what he 23 spoke to me about yesterday and he sent 24 e-mails --25

1 August 11, 2017 MR. KALOTEE: He only spoke to 2 you, not the Chairman? 3 MR. ZYSMAN: No. He spoke to me 4 and Mr. Mirotznik. We were on the 5 phone with him together. 6 MR. KALOTEE: Mr. Mirotznik? 7 MR. MIROTZNIK: First of all, I 8 hate to belabor this meeting at this 9 early hour. I know we all are busy, 10 but I want you to know that no one on 11 this board, none of my board members, 12 disseminate e-mails about board 13 meetings, and time, and specifics. 14 There is an administration here 15 in this building that gets paid; they 16 are full-time employees. So there is 17 none of my board members that slighted 18 you, that I'm aware of, intentionally. 19 I want you to know that --20 MR. KALOTEE: Pardon me --21 MR. MIROTZNIK: Let me just 22 finish. 23 MR. KALOTEE: You are a board 2.4 member. I'm sorry to interrupt you, 25

August 11, 2017 1 Chairman. I am not accusing any of 2 your board members. 3 MR. MIROTZNIK: I just want you to know that you came here --5 MR. KALOTEE: I want you to know 6 I'm not accusing any board members --7 MR. MIROTZNIK: I know that, 8 but --9 MR. KALOTEE: I am accusing the 10 11 policy. MR. MIROTZNIK: You come here 12 with open arms. Everybody is happy to 13 see you and welcoming. I found out 14 last night that there was a slight on 15 an e-mail to you specifically, and I 16 think that we have a board counsel, and 17 we have a procedure here. 18 So if you were left out on the 19 chain, I apologize to you personally, 20 but that will never happen again. I 21 understand all of your contact 22 information has been disseminated 23 properly to the people that get paid to 24 do this job, and you will always be 25

August 11, 2017 1 part of this chain. 2 We hope that you come to every 3 single meeting and not miss one. So 4 that's that on that, okay? Second 5 6 thing is --MR. COHN: The question was 7 raised as to where the board counsel 8 9 is. MR. MIROTZNIK: You know 10 something? Your guess is as good as 11 mine. I have a text to the board 12 counsel. I have no response. I don't 13 know where he is. I am only 14 responsible for my own actions. 15 MR. KALOTEE: Chairman --16 MR. MIROTZNIK: One last thing --17 MR. KALOTEE: We are here to --18 MR. MIROTZNIK: I would like to 19 introduce you to Dr. Caruso. 20 Dr. Caruso is our new board member. 2.1 Bobby Kalotee is a former chair of our 22 committee and he said a few nice words 23 before. I'm sorry you didn't make it. 24 25 Second, for the record, I

August 11, 2017 1 personally spoke to Dr. Politi 2 yesterday sometime in the morning or 3 early afternoon, two days ago. 4 There was a number of items that 5 he needed to get done that continue 6 from the July 21st Contracts Committee 7 meeting. There must have been 60 8 contracts. We didn't get through them. 9 We spent four hours and still didn't 10 get through them. 11 We had a meeting yesterday. 12 got through the 15 or 18 contracts that 13 Dr. Politi and his team need, insisted 14 that they get done, correct Harold? 15 MR. MCDONALD: Correct. 16 MR. MIROTZNIK: John? 17 MR. MAHER: Correct. 18 MR. MIROTZNIK: Dr. Pipia? 19 DR. PIPIA: Yes. 20 MR. MIROTZNIK: Was there any 21 contract yesterday that we stayed here 22 last night to finish that wasn't 23 requested and required for the 24 operation of this hospital? 25

August 11, 2017 1 MR. MCDONALD: They were all 2. necessary. 3 MR. MIROTZNIK: I want to 4 summarize that. That's part of the 5 agenda. If you don't want to do that, 6 if you want to table the entire agenda 7 and you don't want to finish what we 8 did yesterday, let us know that's it. 9 MR. COHN: Rather than shifting 10 the burden of responsibility to us, we 11 have had very infrequent meetings. 12 MR. MIROTZNIK: That's not true. 13 MR. COHN: Our President -- we 14 had the scheduled meetings. We have a 15 president, who is CEO, who is on 16 vacation. We are expected -- what 17 you're asking us to do, or we are being 18 requested to do, is to vote on things 19 that we have absolutely no knowledge 2.0 21 of. I don't understand if Dr. Politi 22 knew he was going on vacation and these 23 contracts weren't done, when ever the 24 issues were raised, why weren't we 25

called into session before he left for vacation?

Why weren't we given the information so that we can digest the information and raise questions? It's a repeated problem and Mike, it's not your problem in the sense that you didn't create the problem, so please understand.

MR. MIROTZNIK: I understand.

MR. COHN: I have been speaking about this for time after time after time. So we have a fiduciary duty. Looking around at the Executive Committee, we have a responsibility to understand what we're doing and we are being given information with less than 24 hours' notice.

So whatever urgency there was must have been created in the last 24 hours. So we had less than 24-hour notice. We get no information.

We come into a board room and we're saying these are important

August 11, 2017 1 matters, important matters, let's vote 2 3 on them. You have no information. If you 4 ask this board right now, if I polled 5 the Executive Committee and I said what 6 are you going to vote on, none of you 7 would know. Maybe you two know. 8 MR. ZYSMAN: I don't think that's 9 true, Steve. 10 MR. COHN: Mr. Kalotee, do you 11 know? Mr. DeLuca, do you know? Do you 12 know what you're being asked to vote 13 on? Do you know the details of what 14 you're being asked to vote on? 15 Because I will ask you what the 16 details are, and I'm not asking to put 17 you into a position. Do you know a 18 name? Do you know an issue? Do you 19 know the details? No. 20 You're just going to be asked to 21 vote because a name and a position. 22 How much -- is it somebody who is going 23 to get paid? How much? What's the 24 credentials? Do we have any 25

August 11, 2017 1 information? I have none. 2. MR. ZYSMAN: You know what, 3 Mr. Cohn? That is not our 4 responsibility of the Board. 5 MR. KALOTEE: Who's 6 responsibility is that? 7 MR. ZYSMAN: That is the 8 responsibility of administration --9 MR. COHN: Then why am I voting 10 on it? 11 MR. KALOTEE: A fiduciary 12 responsibility. Mr. Chairman, I want 13 you to keep one thing very clear in 14 your mind. Chairman, if I have 15 permission to say it? 16 MR. MIROTZNIK: Absolutely. 1'/ MR. ZYSMAN: Sure. 18 MR. KALOTEE: Board is not to do 19 anything if it's a micromanagement. 20 That's none of our business. Our 21 fiduciary responsibility is the 22 policies. In that policy what Mr. Cohn 23 said is equally important, so let's not 24 get into that. 25

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If anything, when this corporation was created, I'm one of the original members here back. I don't know how much knowledge you have about the charter, how the charter was created, how the charter was formed.

If anything, even though he was nonvoting member, Frank Saracino, former superintendent of schools, he had a great knowledge, great help. We don't want to be micro managers.

I fought when I was a Chairman.

I will fight again as a board member,
but our responsibility is to support
the Chairman and do whatever fiduciary
responsibility, set the policy, impose
the policies, hold the administration
responsible of any failure of that
policy.

For the record, we are not going to have 24-hour notice meeting. That's illegal meeting, by the way. There is a timing. Shelly Lotenberg can tell you, when the Newsday is looking for

1 August 11, 2017 under freedom of information, it's more 2 than 24-hour notice. 3 But the Contracts Committee can 4 have that 24-hour notice meeting, but 5 not any other meeting. Just remember, 6 if the counsel is going to tell me any differently, then I want the charter to 8 be given to every new board member. 9 Actually, I will request the 10 charter and bylaws must be provided to 11 every board member. I think they have 12 equal fiduciary responsibility to read 13 them, so they understand what our 14 15 responsibility is. Would you be kind enough to make 16 sure it's available to every board 17 member? 18 MS. RYAN: Yes. There is a 19 compliance packet. There is an 20 on-boarding packet that John Ciampoli 21 -- I will personally give it to you. 22 MR. KALOTEE: No, no, not to me 23 only. Every board member. 24 MS. RYAN: All the board members. 25

1 August 11, 2017 Yes, I will make sure. 2 MR. KALOTEE: Because they never 3 received it, that's a JCAHO violation. 4 The board member is equally 5 responsible, in case you don't know. 6 am very much aware of that. 7 If they were not provided that, 8 all their voting rights are violation. 9 They didn't count. Are you aware of 10 that, Counsel? 11 MS. RYAN: Yes. 12 MR. KALOTEE: So I'm asking you 13 do you have them? 14 MR. COHN: It's been so many 15 years, I would make the assumption that 16 I had it. 17 MR. KALOTEE: So if anyone did 18 not have it, their vote didn't even 19 count. So I just want to say let's not 20 get into each other's right and wrong. 21 Today is more important what is good 22 for the hospital. So I want to refer 23 2.4 to that. Let's take care of the hospital, 25

August 11, 2017 1 if it's something most important. 2 it is needed because the board member 3 needs the time, I think we can convene tomorrow. I don't care if it's a 5 Saturday. I don't care if it's a 6 Sunday. We should, because of the best 7 interest of the hospital. 8 And other things, no meeting need 9 to be noticed -- it's one-year advance 1.0 notice. Every meeting should be in 11 that particular day, so you don't need 12 24-hour notice. It should be published 13 legally in advance. 14 If it's not published legally in 15 advance, Shelley, you're very much 16 aware of that, because you done a 17 fantastic job when I was here, and I 18 thank God you are here, and if it's not 19 a published meeting, it's not a legal 20 meeting if it's not to public notice. 21 22 Do we have a public notice on this meeting? 23 24 MS. RYAN: Yes, we do. MS. LOTENBERG: Yes, we do. 25

KALOTEE: Let me answer that, 14 because if you are a fool, does it mean 15 that it's my fault? Or if I'm 16 ignorant, does that mean it's your 17 fault? If somebody told you it's not 18 your fault, I'm not telling you that 19 you are not intelligent. 20 What I'm saying is, if they 21 didn't call you, then you did not want 2.2 it. It's nobody's fault, but the rules 2.3 are every board member is -- Paul 24 Pipia, you are a board member. Is that 25

What everybody -- and 5 Frank Saracino, you was there, even 6 nonvoting member. Were you able to 7 attend every meeting at that time? You 8 had many of the meetings you came to 9 attend. 10 So because they cannot vote 11 doesn't mean -- it's a responsibility 12 of every board member. That's what 13 they pledge, to come and do their 14 15 fiduciary responsibility. MR. COHN: Can I just finish what 16 I was going to say? 17 MR. MIROTZNIK: Yes, Mr. Cohn. 18 MR. COHN: I would make the 19 assumption that with each and every one 20 of us on the Board, because we are 21 trying to do the right thing for the 22 hospital, and we are supposed to 23 24 discuss things.

So while you guys are familiar

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with it, I remember being here when the jail contract was up, and individually we raised very, very, very good concerns about the contract. So by not having us uninformed, you're losing the ability for you to comment and add thoughts to what you're voting on.

I would want each and every one of you to know what we're voting on, so that if I miss something, you can tell me what I'm missing.

You can add to it, because we are a board, and we are supposed to act as a board together.

knowledgeable because you were here last night, and I appreciate that, believe me, I applaud you for being here last night, but because you're knowledgeable and you're going to vote on it, you're voting on it without any input from Mr. DeLuca, who was a CFO for this hospital for 20-some odd years.

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MR. DELUCA: COO.

MR. COHN: Mr. Kumar, who is now on the board, who was a chairman of the board. Myself, I have been on this board for a number of years. You are now prepared to vote on something without any input and we may raise something that you may have missed, or you may not have thought of.

So my problem is that I
appreciate what you want to do, and if
you are comfortable with it, by all
means, you guys vote on it, but you
can't expect anyone who has no
knowledge of it to vote on it.

I would have to say that I would want the input from these gentlemen and if you weren't here, I would want your input before I vote on something.

So for the purpose of this meeting, and I will go on the record, without forming an opinion as to anything that's with this bundle in front of me, I'm not prepared to vote

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on any of it and will abstain on each and every one of these votes.

I have said repeatedly, probably throughout the last five years, I truly resent the position that this ever put the board members in, to repeatedly do this to us, that they give us no time to do our job. We all have jobs.

I can't read this -- to give me less than 24 hours -- if you gave me the package, to expect me to put aside everything else in my life to read this and be prepared.

If I sat down, this is a few hours, probably five hours, four hours, of my reading, and to expect me to put down everything that I have in my life to do it with less than 24 hours, of which probably half of that is time that I sleep, and get up, and to just get ready to come here, I think is unfair to us.

If you guys are prepared to vote on it, anything, that's your decision.
