1.0 POLICY

1.1. It is the policy of the Nassau Health Care Corporation (NHCC) to provide a safe environment for all patients, visitors, and staff by monitoring hospital access. NHCC recognizes the important role that family members and visitors play in a patient's healing process and promotes a patient-centered approach to care. The purpose of this policy is to define and set expectations regarding persons visiting hospitalized patients amid the outbreak of novel coronavirus (COVID-19) in New York.

1.2. **Definitions**

- 1.2.1. <u>Patient</u> anyone admitted to NUMC or being clinically treated in any of its Emergency Departments or outpatient clinics.
- 1.2.2. <u>Visitor</u> anyone else who is not an employee of NHCC, not a vendor, and present for a legal and lawful purpose. Included in this category are invited guests of employees and delivery persons.
- 1.2.3. <u>Justified Clinical Restrictions</u> any clinically necessary restriction or limitation imposed by NUMC on a patient's visitation rights which restriction or limitation is necessary to provide safe care to the patient or other patients. A Justified Clinical Restriction may be based on, one or more of the following: (i) a court order limiting or restraining contact; (ii) behavior presenting a direct risk or threat to the patient, NUMC staff, or others in the immediate environment; (iii) behavior disruptive of the functioning of the patient; (iv) the patient's risk of infection by the visitor; (v) the visitor's risk of infection by the patient; (vi) extraordinary protections because of a pandemic or infectious disease outbreak; (vii) substance abuse treatment protocols requiring restricted visitation; (viii) the patient's need for privacy or rest; (ix) when the patient is undergoing a clinical intervention or procedure; and (x) reasonable limitations on the number of visitors at any one time.

2.0 PROCEDURE

- 2.1 **For Visitors and Caregivers**. The following patient visitation guidelines help avoid the spread of infection resulting from COVID-19, ensuring a safe environment for all:
 - 2.1.1 To protect the care of our patients, the following groups should not visit any NHCC campus unless they are seeking treatment:
 - **2.1.1.1** Those who are ill, and
 - **2.1.1.2** Children under the age of fifteen (15)
 - 2.1.2 Visitors will be screened for illness prior to entering patient areas. Sick visitors will be asked to leave.
 - 2.1.3 Additional restrictions may be imposed based on the patient's clinical status.
 - **2.1.3.1** Inpatient locations
 - 2.1.3.1.1 Visitors are not permitted at this time except for end of life care or on a case by case basis.
 - **2.1.3.1.2** Two visitors per pediatric patient are allowed in the pediatric units, limited to parents, guardians, or family care partners only.
 - **2.1.3.1.3** Two visitors per patient are allowed in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, limited to parents or support persons only.
 - **2.1.3.1.4** Two visitors are permitted for obstetric patients, limited to partners and grandparents only.
 - **2.1.3.2** Emergency Departments (ED)
 - **2.1.3.2.1** Adult patients are not permitted visitors; exceptions will be evaluated on a case by case basis.
 - **2.1.3.2.2** Pediatric patients may have two visitors, limited to parent or caregiver only.
 - **2.1.3.3** Ambulatory and Outpatient Locations
 - **2.1.3.3.1** VISITORS are suspended.

2.1.3.3.2 Suspended.

- 2.1.4 All visitors should self-screen for contagious diseases before arriving at any NHCC campus and before accessing patient care areas.
 - **2.1.4.1** Have you experienced any of the following in the last three days?
 - **2.1.4.1.1** Fever
 - **2.1.4.1.2** Cough
 - **2.1.4.1.3** Runny or stuffy nose
 - **2.1.4.1.4** Vomiting or diarrhea
 - **2.1.4.1.5** Shortness of breath/respiratory symptoms
 - **2.1.4.2** Have you been exposed to or come into contact with someone with the following in the last three days?
 - **2.1.4.2.1** Influenza
 - **2.1.4.2.2** Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV)
 - **2.1.4.2.3** Diarrheal illness or 'stomach bug'
 - **2.1.4.2.4** COVID-19

2.1.5 **Visiting Hours- SUSPENDED**

2.1.6 **Package Inspection**

2.1.6.1 To ensure the safety of our patients, visitors, and staff, the NHCC reserves the right to search packages entering and leaving any of our facilities.

2.1.7 **Visiting Restrictions**

2.1.7.1 Visiting may be denied or further restricted in some instances pursuant to Justified Clinical Restrictions identified in Section 1.3.3.
